SpayToday is proud to announce an amazing milestone of performing 100,000 spay and neuter surgeries (and counting)! These procedures are important to the local community for a number of reasons and the clinic has a valuable role to play not only in Lakewood, but the entire Denver-Metro region.

SpayToday is a non profit vet clinic in Lakewood, CO, whose mission is to eliminate animal overpopulation, homelessness, neglect, and abuse through spay/neuter surgeries and keep companion animals healthy and at home with the people who love them. The organization serves indigent and vulnerable populations in the Denver metro and surrounding areas. They recognize the importance of the human-animal bond and provide basic vet care for animals in need at no charge to their owners.

"Thousands of people in our community have to decide between providing basic, lifesaving vet care for their beloved pets or purchasing food and/or caring for themselves and their families. SpayToday was founded in 2009. Since its inception, it has performed thousands of spay/neuter surgeries on dogs, cats, and rabbits. On July 30th, SpayToday performed its 100K surgery on a female dog named Murphy. The organization is celebrating this impressive milestone on Monday, September 16th, at its clinic in Lakewood. It will continue the celebration at its annual fundraiser, Spayghetti & No Balls, on October 17, 2024.
